	agricultural supply chains. We appreciate the cross-departmental collaboration within FAO to develop and disseminate these tools.  Japan appreciates the inputs from COFO to the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development towards achieving the SDGs which include the key message regarding sustainable use of forest resources along with forest conservation and restoration. We look forward to further discussing the activities relating to agriculture and forestry interlinkages under Agenda Item 5.		
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
